Spring Reminders

Your Community Information

The Greens at Hawk Valley community consists of: 65 homes 16 buildings 14 acres of land There are two community wells supplying water. The roads in the community are private, which means the community maintains the roads. Our community shares the maintenance of the roads and the water wells with our neighbors in The Hawk.

Call If you have heavy or large items for removal. Trash should be put to curb after 5 pm the day before your pickup day and empty receptacles brought back in by the end of the pick up day.

For community unit owners' convenience, there is an established organic dump area for community unit owners to dispose of larger quantities of organic material, including branches, clippings from bushes and shrubbery, dead plants, potting soil, and end of season annuals. The area is located at the top of Hawk Valley Lane just off the cul-de-sac, entering behind the green service boxes. Please dispose of all organic materials as far back as possible in the area, preferably behind the red marker. Remember this area is not for disposal of plastic, glass, paper or metal items; nor household items or chemicals, oil or paint.

If you prefer that the Landscaping service provider not trim and tend to the flower beds around your unit, you may request a red flag to place in a prominent area of your yard.

Bird feeders and houses must be located in the back of the home, not hung from trees, and may not interfere with maintenance.

Pets are limited to 2 per unit. At no time may a pet be left unattended outside the unit, or fastened to any tree, shrub or structure.

Outdoor Reminders

As the weather warms up and we start spending more time outdoors, we invite you to take a moment to reflect on the points below.

Paint

Exterior maintenance and painting of doors and trim is covered by the association. Requests for exterior painting should be sent to our property manager.

Front doors and shutters – Valspar color is Treeline # 5006-4C semigloss Trim and Garage Doors – Valspar color is Stone Manor # 6006-2A semigloss

<u>Deck Stain</u>

Semi-transparent cedar naturaltone Preauthorized and recommended deck stain & sealer manufacturers are Olympic or Valspar.

Other manufacturers carry a very similar or matching color. If choosing a manufacturer other than Olympic or Valspar the stain MUST match the

approved semi-transparent cedar naturaltone color.

It is recommended that decks should be sealed every (2) two years or as necessary. Decks should be checked for mildew and cleaned as needed annually.

Recycling Reminders

Remember the big 4 that go in your recycling bin:
Corrugated cardboard (flattened)
Plastic bottles with jugs and necks*
Metal food and beverage cans*

- Glass jars and bottles*

Remember that items such as newspapers, clothing hangers, aluminum foil, and plastic garbage bags do not go in the recycling bin.

*Please note the items should be emptied, rinsed and lids removed, before being placed in the recycling bin.
